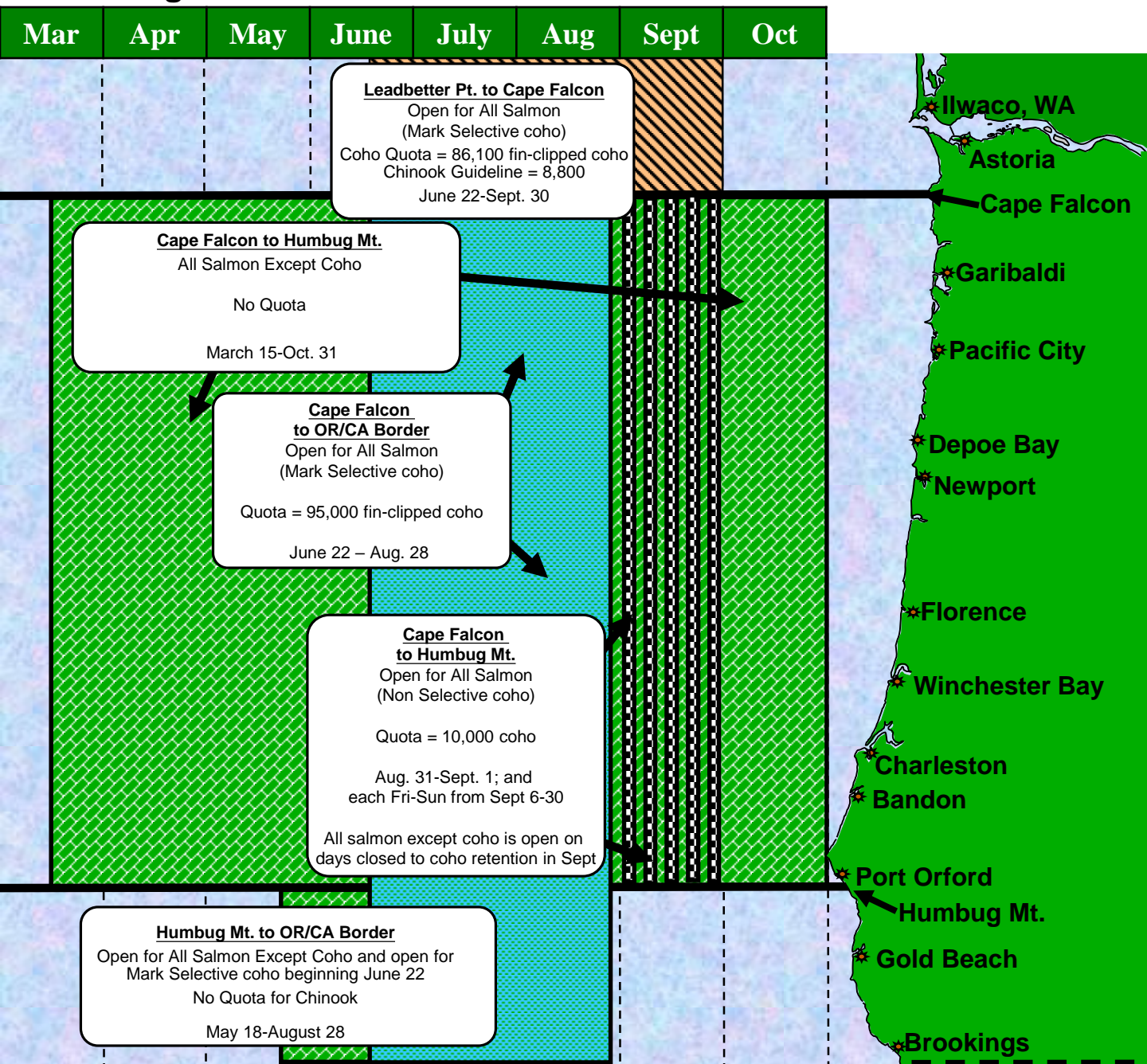

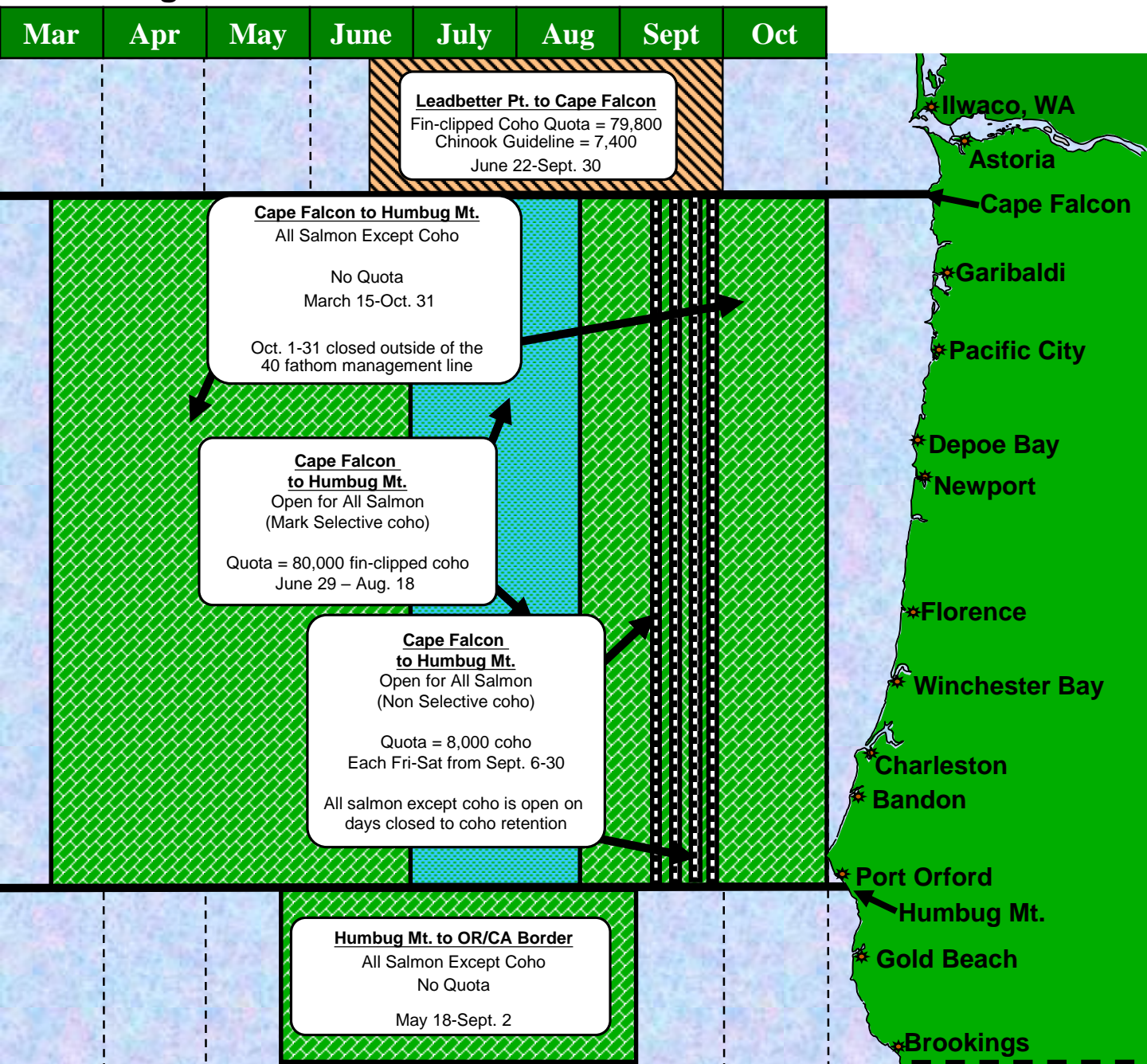

# Oregon Ocean Recreational Salmon Alternative I – 3/12/2019



-  All salmon, 2 per day only one of which may be a Chinook. All coho must have a healed adipose fin clip.
  -  All salmon except coho, 2 per day.
  -  All salmon, 2 per day. All coho must have a healed adipose fin clip. A portion of any remaining coho quota may be rolled forward to the September non mark selective coho season on an impact neutral basis.
  -  All salmon, 2 per day. Open for all salmon, and no fin-clip restriction on retained coho.
- Other Regulations:
- 1) In the Stonewall Bank Yelloweye Rockfish Cons. Area, salmon fishing is limited to trolling on open "all depth halibut" days.
  - 2) No more than 2 single point barbless hooks and one line when fishing for salmon or when a salmon is on board.
  - 3) Minimum lengths: Chinook – 24", coho – 16", steelhead – 20"; no size restriction for pink, chum, or sockeye salmon.

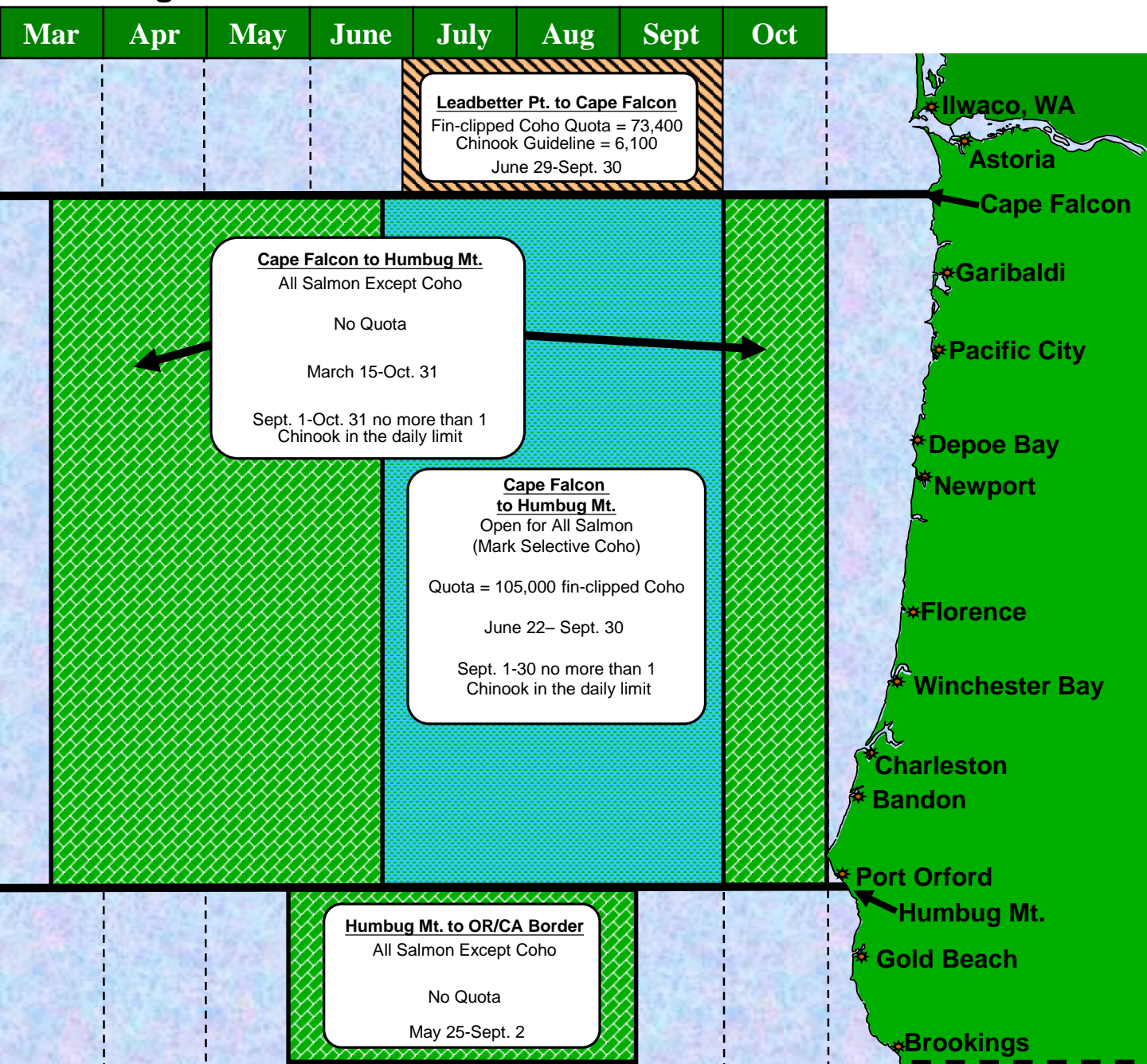
# Oregon Ocean Recreational Salmon Alternative II – 3/12/2019






-  All salmon, 2 per day only one of which may be a Chinook. All coho must have a healed adipose fin clip.
-  All salmon except coho, 2 per day. Closed outside of the 40 fathom management line Oct. 1-31
-  All salmon, 2 per day. All coho must have a healed adipose fin clip. A portion of any remaining coho quota may be rolled forward to the September non mark selective coho season on an impact neutral basis.
-  All salmon, 2 per day. Open for all salmon, and no fin-clip restriction on retained coho.

- Other Regulations:**
- 1) In the Stonewall Bank Yelloweye Rockfish Cons. Area, salmon fishing is limited to trolling on open “all depth halibut” days.
  - 2) No more than 2 single point barbless hooks and one line when fishing for salmon or when a salmon is on board.
  - 3) Minimum lengths: Chinook – 24”, coho – 16”, steelhead – 20”; no size restriction for pink, chum, or sockeye salmon.

# Oregon Ocean Recreational Salmon Alternative III – 3/12/2019



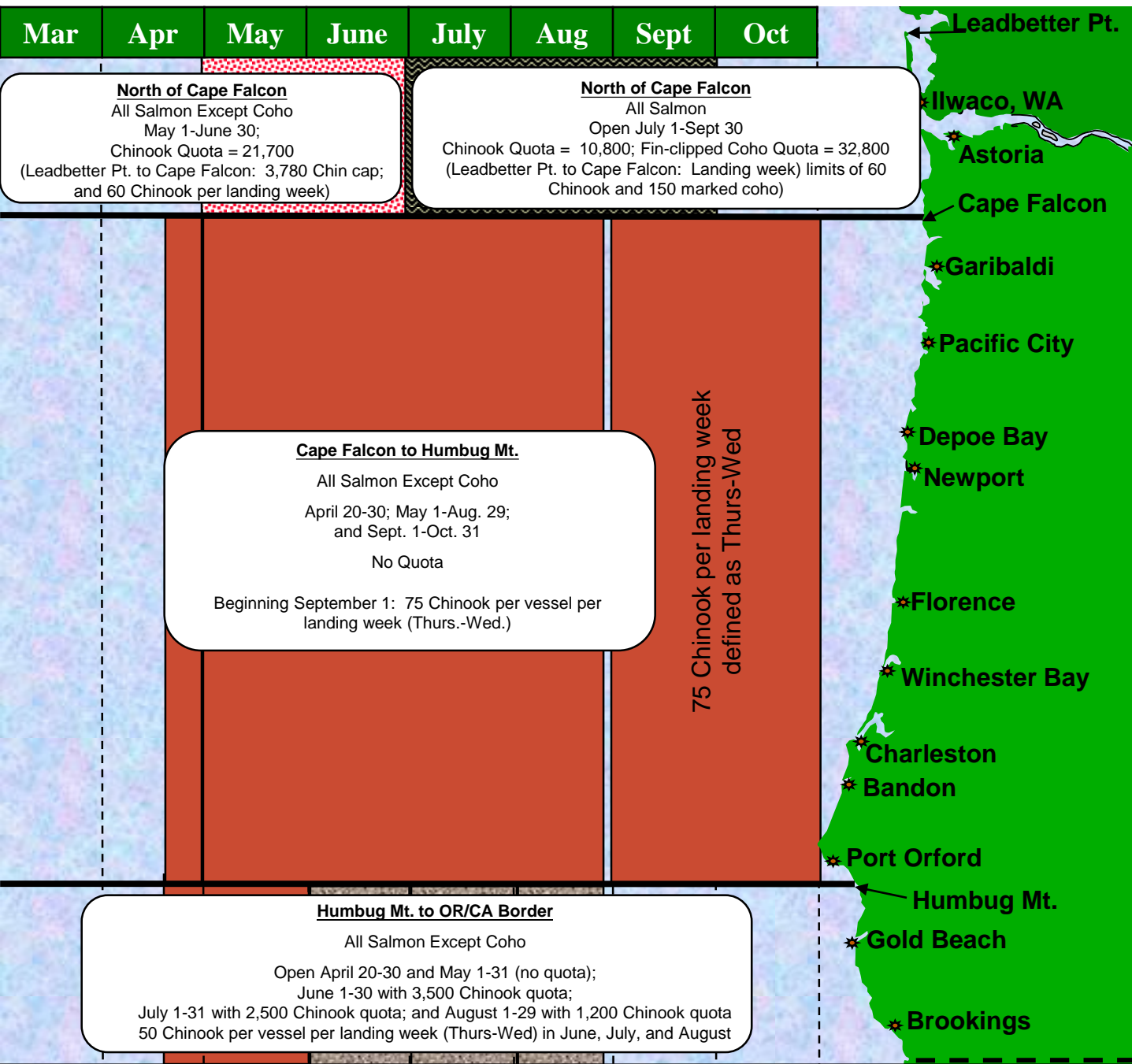
-  All salmon, 2 per day only one of which may be a Chinook. All coho must have a healed adipose fin clip.
-  All salmon except coho, 2 per day. Sept. 1-Oct. 31 no more than 1 Chinook in the daily limit.
-  All salmon, 2 per day. All coho must have a healed adipose fin clip. Sept. 1-30 no more than 1 Chinook in the daily limit.


**Other Regulations:**


- 1) In the Stonewall Bank Yelloweye Rockfish Cons. Area, salmon fishing is limited to trolling on open "all depth halibut" days.
- 2) No more than 2 single point barbless hooks and one line when fishing for salmon or when a salmon is on board.
- 3) Minimum lengths: Chinook – 24", coho – 16", steelhead – 20"; no size restriction for pink, chum, or sockeye salmon.

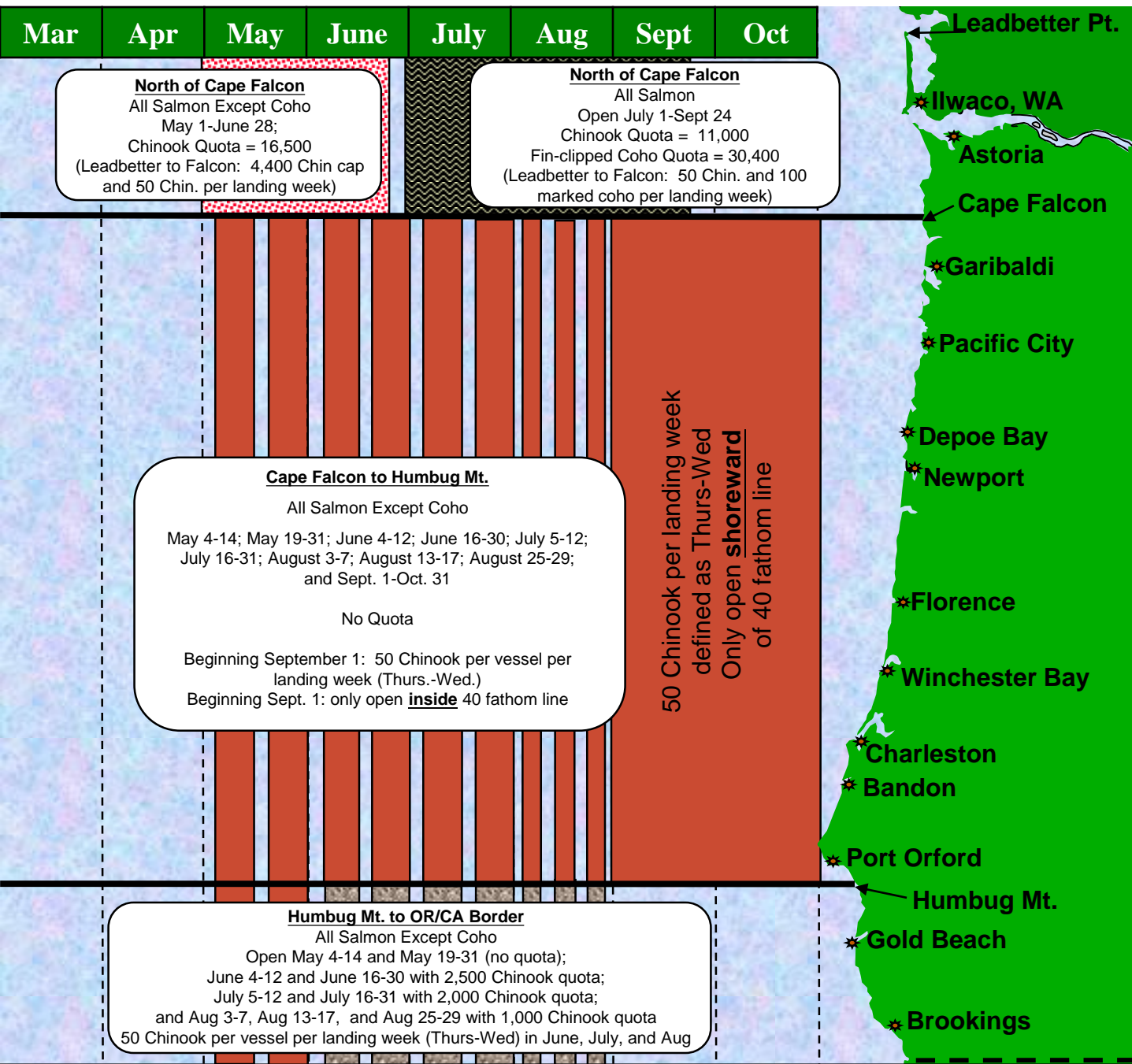

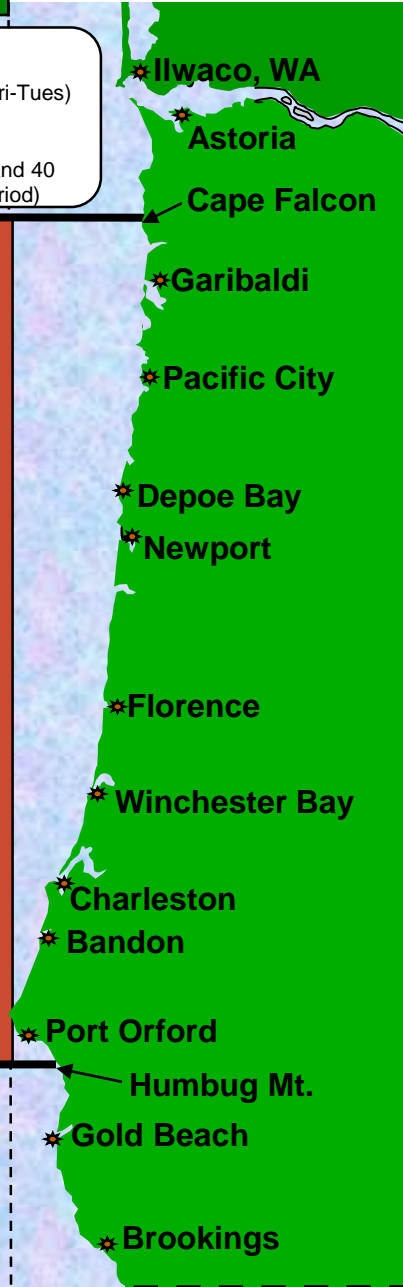
