Proposed ODFW Crab Records Requirement Summary

The Oregon Department of Agriculture (ODA) and Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife (ODFW) Dungeness crab and biotoxin Rules Advisory Committee (RAC) recommended **expanding ODFW record keeping requirements for Dungeness crab.** This information is essential to support crab traceability through the market chain. Specifically, the new requirements will allow ODA to increase public health safety by helping prevent sales of adulterated crab harvested from a biotoxin management zone (BMZ) after elevated levels of a biotoxin are detected, and to determine how much adulterated product reached consumers versus how much was stopped in the market chain. ODFW plans to implement these additional record requirements prior to the opening of the 2017-18 crab season. The new requirements would include the following:

1. All retail fish dealers, wholesale fish dealers, buyers, food fish canners and shellfish canners who receive or buy crab must add the date of landing and harvest area of the crab purchased to their currently required records of who they buy or receive crab from; and
2. All retail fish dealers, wholesale fish dealers, buyers, limited fish sellers, food fish canners and shellfish canners who receive or buy of crab must keep records of who they sell crab to prior to the ultimate consumer, including sales to restaurants. Required information would include name and phone number of person or business to whom the crab are sold, date of sale, date of landing, amount of pounds sold, and area of harvest.
