- Location:** Roseburg field office. Work is conducted in Douglas County. Housing is not provided.
- Salary:** 17.32/hour
- Duration:** Not to exceed 400 hours (June 2024 – September 2024)
- Job Description:** Primary duties will be to provide a student intern with on-the-job training experiences related to Columbian white-tailed and black-tailed deer and Roosevelt elk capture/monitoring and wildlife habitat management. The intern will gain the ability to develop and refine academic and professional goals as well as understand the structure and operation of a natural resource management organization. Intern will also have the opportunity to participate in wildlife research, data collection used to guide wildlife management, and wildlife habitat projects. Duties include:
- Assists district and wildlife research staff in monitoring GPS radio marked deer and elk and investigating possible causes of mortalities when retrieving radio collars in the Indigo, Dixon and Melrose Wildlife Management Units. This opportunity requires the ability to drive on four-wheel drive roads (20%).
 - Assists district wildlife staff conduct wildlife habitat restoration activities in the Umpqua National Forest. Activities such as improving nutritional forage, water developments, and seasonal road closures. This may also include monitoring sensitive species prior to conducting habitat projects. (30%).
 - Assist district wildlife staff monitor wolf activity in the Indigo and Dixon wildlife management units. This includes setting-up and monitoring trail cameras, monitoring radio collar signals, and scouting areas for wolf activity (20%).
 - Assist district wildlife staff conduct upland game bird surveys and trapping & banding ducks, recording biological information and location data in the district. (20%).
 - Collects, records and reports data under supervision and direction (10%).

Work Conditions: Frequently works outside during inclement weather, and work can begin before and after daylight hours, and occasionally requires working on weekends.

This position requires a flexible work schedule that varies in the number of hours worked on a daily basis, but not necessarily each day, and does not exceed forty (40) hours in a work week. Work exceeding 40 hours per week requires prior approval by the supervisor.
