- Job Description:** This position will assist ODFW regional wildlife staff and United States Forest Service staff in conducting white-headed woodpecker research and monitoring in the Wallowa-Whitman national forest. Duties:

- Deploying audio recording units (15%)
- Nest monitoring, trapping and radio-marking white-headed woodpeckers (15%)
- Locating and nest searching for white-headed woodpeckers (15%)
- Radio telemetry on white-headed woodpeckers (25%)
- Field Habitat Measurements (30%)

Requirements: Preference will be given to candidates with the ability to work independently, especially in a remote or field setting.

Working Conditions: Frequently work outside during inclement weather (hot, cold, wet), required to work before and after daylight (at times), occasionally camping is required in remote areas.
