Duration: Not to exceed 400 hours (10 weeks) May 2024 - September 2024

Job Description: This position will assist ODFW regional wildlife staff and United States Forest Service staff in conducting white-headed woodpecker research and monitoring in the Wallowa-Whitman national forest for five weeks. The remaining portion of work will be helping with ODFW and the Powder Basin Watershed Council in beaver research and habitat improvements on the North Fork of the Burnt River. Duties:

- Deploying audio recording units (8%)
- Nest monitoring, trapping and radio-marking white-headed woodpeckers (8%)
- Locating and nest searching for white-headed woodpeckers (7%)
- Radio telemetry on white-headed woodpeckers (12%)
- Field Habitat Measurements (15%)
- Beaver/habitat surveys (10%)
- Habitat improvement projects for beaver (30%)
- Assisting watershed council with daily work (10%)

Requirements: Preference will be given to candidates with the ability to work independently, especially in a remote or field setting.

Working Conditions: Frequently work outside during inclement weather (hot, cold, wet), required to work before and after daylight (at times), occasionally camping is required in remote areas.
