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Affidavit of Damage, Nuisance, or Public Health Risk Problems Caused by Wildlife

By Oregon law, people may address problems caused by wildlife on land they own or lawfully occupy. However, the law requires that the landowner or lawful occupant first obtain a permit from the Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife (ODFW) for certain wildlife species (those classified as game mammal, game bird, fur-bearing mammal or nongame wildlife species). This affidavit authorizes a person holding an ODFW Wildlife Control Operator Permit to serve as your agent to resolve damage, nuisance or public health risk problems caused by furbearers, unprotected mammals (excluding moles) and western gray squirrels.

An affidavit is not required of the landowner or lawful occupant to delegate responsibility to an agent for problems caused by predatory animals (feral swine, coyotes, rabbits, rodents), European starlings, house sparrows, Eurasian collard- doves or rock doves as long as no live wildlife is being transport off the site.

All sections of this form must be completed by both Wildlife Control Operator and Landowner
