1. Have you attached a valid sales receipt from an out-of-state USDA licensed breeder, valid agency transfer of ownership permit identifying the animal was propagated and born in legal captivity, or other documentation as required by the Department? \_\_\_\_\_ (*Initial here*)
  2. I understand that a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (CVI), signed by the Veterinarian in the State of origin, is needed to legally import the animal(s) into Oregon. \_\_\_\_\_ (*Initial here*)
